Minutes of the Roosevelt City Arts, Parks and Recreation Committee

Business:

Winterfest. January 9th the skating rink will be ready to use. There will be a photography class January 9 and 16 with a limit of 10-16 people. Yoga on the 16th. Two paint nights on the 16th. Sledding hosted by NCC will be on January 23rd. Porta potties will be needed. All events are posted on the APR Facebook page. Payments will be made directly to instructors via Venmo. Pickleball was cancelled because the junior high no longer is allowing outside events.

Committee Member Terms: A discussion was had about commitment to the committee. There are some people on the committee who have not been attending meetings. It was asked how everyone was feeling about their appointments. It was mentioned that it is hard to judge feelings based on this past year because, due to COVID, we were very limited in what we could do and many things that were planned had to be cancelled. It needs to be remembered that we are still doing good things despite the challenges. Cody Aland of the city council mentioned that the work we do is appreciated and that it is not going unnoticed. It was suggested that we reach out to committee members who are not attending and see if they would still like to be on the committee. Wendy Nicholson asked that each subcommittee chair speak to the members of their subcommittee and see how things are going and if they would like to continue to be on the committee.

Wendy brought up that she would like to see better communication from the city. An event was planned around the opening of the ice rink and the committee was not included in the planning. The city employees said that if citizens have questions always direct them to contact the city office.

Reports from Subcommittees:

Arts: The Christmas lights contest was a success. There were 10 or 11 participants. The winners were happy to receive the cash prizes.

Parks: Jr. Jazz and Men's League basketball were cancelled.

Recreation: The cross-country skiing track setter was received. It was purchased with money from the subcommittees budget. Preston Kadleck suggested that we experiment with the machine this year and

figure out how it works. Next year we might want to rent it out to other cities. Brent Fenn felt that renting it out to other cities might be problematic.
