Call to Order by Wendy Nicholson, Chair

Minutes. Motion to approve January minutes by Daniel Mauchley, 2nd by Preston. Voting unanimous to approve minutes.

Business

July 4. Mark Winterton said he told Mayor Bird in July 2020 that he could not help with Roosevelt's 4th of July for 2021. He said he is available to help with the Red Mud Run but has other commitments in the evening. The sound usually costs \$1600. It needs to be set up in time for the Red Mud Run. The person who usually does the sound for Roosevelt is doing it for Vernal this year. Mark will ask for recommendations on another sound person. Rowdy Cloward will speak to a local sound person and see if he can do it. The band usually costs \$3000-5000. The needs to be booked no later than March 1. The band will need a camper to stay in before the concert and we should provide them with dinner. Chris Anderton is sometime willing to put them up in his hotel. Dustin Glines volunteered to help set up the stage back drop.

Winterfest. Overall we had fewer events this year due to COVID. The events we did have were successful.

Ice Skating Rink. It has been a big success. Some people have asked if we can provide skate rentals in the future. Brent Fenn asked Vernal about skate rental and they cautioned against committing to do rentals. There does not appear to be a good solution towards doing rentals.

Legislative Funding Opportunities. There is money available from the state for recreation or items that focus on tourism. \$100 million is proposed. Phillip Bertoch recommended at larger skate park, a pump track, pickle ball, bouldering, exercise equipment in the park. A community theater was recommended. Ryan Clayburn said that LeeNichole Marret is working getting a recreation grant for the walking/nature park by the hospital. Daniel Mauchley suggested a ball park, lighting, softer grade for runners next to the walking path. Royce Porter suggested inclosing the old tennis courts.

Ryan Clayburn asked Wendy Nicholson to send a list of project ideas to the city. Subcommittees should submit their lists prior to the next meeting.

Subcommittees

Art. For Winterfest a photo class, yoga and paint nights were held. The art subcommittee would like to know about if the promised events calendar for the website is ready.

Parks. Ice Skating was big success. No indoor sporting events are being allowed by the school district. There is huge demand for pickle ball and there are not enough courts. A private citizen started a cornhole tournament to help at the Grace Events Center. Wendy asked why the city did not direct him

to coordinate his event through the APR Committee. City league baseball and softball signups have started.

Recreation. The sledding event during Winterfest went well. The porta potties that were provided were appreciated. The planned nature park in partnership with the hospital will be built in phases. Grants are being secured. They are looking for additional community partners.

Report for the City Council. Nothing to report.
