Minutes: March Minutes: Motion to approve, Emily Graham. 2nd Preston Kadleck. Voting was unanimous in favor of approving. April: Motion to approve, Preston Kadleck. 2nd Shannon Staker. Voting was unanimous in favor of approving the minutes.

Business:

New Chair nominations: Royce Porter nominated Preston Kadleck. Amy Snow 2nd. Voting was unanimous in favor of Preston Kadleck.

Preston began managing the meeting.

Nomination for Recreation Subcommittee chair: Preston Kadleck nominated Charles Embleton. Emily Graham 2nd. Voting was unanimous in favor of Charles Embleton.

There have been no applications for the vacant Art subcommittee member position. The committee was encouraged to invite people to apply.

Motion to change meetings from first Wednesday to first Thursday of the month. Motion to approve Emily Graham, 2nd by Rowdy Cloward. Voting was unanimous in favor.

Robin Hatch from Northeastern Counseling spoke about Family Dinner Night September 27, 2021. Vendors at 4:30 with a 5:30 start. She has a grant to give each person a \$5 token (up to 1000) to be used at the food trucks that night. It will be at Constitution Park. 250 people attended last year. Last year there were only two food trucks, and they ran out of food. The Prevention Advisory Committee will provide games. She prefers to have local vendors. The Don Busenbark of the city council suggested be charge the \$50 fee for the food trucks but then give them the money back if they show up. This should encourage more food trucks to attend.

July 4th: Robin Hatch will do the Mud Pit and the t-shirts. L&L will provide a trailer to be used as the green room for the concert. Mark Winterton has said he will find an opening act. Rowdy Cloward will follow up with Mark Winterton. Rowdy Cloward is in contact with the company providing the sound. We will start advertising June 1.

Reports from Committees:

Arts: Mary Poppins is playing at UHS. There is discussion with Mindy Palmer about doing a summer drama camp for kids. The committee thinks that we gave \$5000 to her last year and can do the same this year.

Parks: Considering pickleball courts near the library. They are looking at possible grants for courts. There will be a pickleball tournament during UBIC. Royce will post information about current games on the APR Facebook page. Royce is planning on doing a weekly tennis activity for kids. Baseball and softball are going well. A new committee is being formed to work on raising money for the new baseball diamonds. Some the city's COVID money could be applied to the new diamonds.

The old library might be made into a museum.

Recreation: A \$150,000 grant from the Utah Office of Outdoor Recreation was awarded for the nature park. They are applying for additional grants. The nature park will have a 1 acre fishing pond. $\frac{3}{4}$ of it will be accessible. It will be stocked by the DNR. The park is 14 acres and is north of the hospital. There will be a Disc Golf clinic on June 12 from 9-11 am. The first 100 people will get a disc. There will be experts there to teach people how to play. The new signs will be installed prior to the event. The committee is considering a bike bingo activity and a bike repair day.

Report from City Council: Don Busenbark stated that the council appreciates all efforts. He said that they will do all that they can to support us. He invited us to attend city council meetings.
